Residential Fence/Retaining Wall Permits

Fences

When is a permit needed? A permit is required for replacing the posts, changing the height, or moving a fence from its current location. A retaining wall that is over 4 feet in height, including the footings, requires a permit and an engineered design. A fence permit is also required for pool enclosures.

What are the requirements for a Fence?

- 1. Metal fences shall not be allowed in the required front yard in any district, unless it is of a decorative nature, does not cross property lines and shall not prevent access by city crews to water meters.
- 2. No fence or hedge shall exceed three (3) feet height in the required front yard in any district.
- 3. No fence shall exceed eight (8) feet in height.
- 4. Fences shall be constructed of customary urban fencing materials and shall be aesthetically consistent with buildings and fences in the area.
- 5. For corner lots, no fence shall be constructed within twenty-five (25) feet of the intersection street right-of-way line.
- 6. Swimming Pools A wall or fence not less than six (6) feet in height, with self-enclosing and self-latching gates that are lockable at all entrances, completely encloses either the pool area or the surrounding yard area.
- 7. Be sure to check with your homeowner's association to see if there are deed restrictions that may apply.

What is needed to obtain a permit? A plan review is required for all instances listed above. A permit fee of _____ is due upon permit issuance.

Submittal documents: Fill out a Residential permit application and submit (2) site plans which include the following: (You may use a copy of a survey of your lot and draw the requirements below.)

- 1. Location of main building on lot and all other structures on property.
- 2. Location of proposed fence on property.
- 3. Height of fence.
- 4. Construction material used.
- 5. All streets and alleys.
- 6. Location of pool on property in relation to structures if for purpose of pool enclosure.

Retaining Walls

When is a permit needed? A permit is required for a retaining wall that is over 4 feet in height, including the footings.

What is needed to obtain a permit? A plan review is required for all instances listed above.

Submittal documents: Fill out a Residential permit application and submit (2) site plans which include the following: (You may use a copy of a survey of your lot and draw the requirements below.)

- 1. Location of main building on lot and all other structures on property.
- 2. Location of proposed retaining wall on property.
- 3. All streets and alleys.
- 4. Engineered design for retaining wall over 4 feet in height (including the footings) to include height of wall and materials used.
